Municipal Meetings

As part of The Board's advocacy efforts this year, we reached out to 7 municipalities that make up the communities of RVS. The Board has scheduled meetings with them and to date we have met with the Town of Irricana, Rocky View County and the Village of Beiseker, the City of Airdrie, the Town of Crossfield and the Town of Cochrane. We will also be meeting soon with the City of Chestermere.

New Dual Credit Start-up Funding Coming from Alberta Education

- Dual credits can be earned by high school students in grades 10-12 who participate in a post-secondary course and receive instruction from a post-secondary employed instructor. They receive a high school credit that counts towards graduation and a post-secondary credit from that institution in course work, apprenticeship or journeyperson certification.
- Currently, RVS has dual credit partnership agreements with Olds College, SAIT and U of C, and students are enrolled in psychology, agriculture technology, veterinary technology, introduction to agriculture mechanics and welding programs.
- RVS applied for and received additional funding for the fall of 2022 through the Alberta Education Dual Partnerships with post-secondary institutions allow RVS to offer its students the opportunity to begin working towards their career goals before graduation from high school.

Division to Consider an Administrative Procedure for Before and After School Care Programs

• Third-party before and after school programs have been run in some RVS schools since 2008. RVS administration will provide trustees with more information about the delivery of these programs along with its recommendation to the Board on development of an Administrative Procedure by Jan. 26, 2023.

Student Showcase: Board Recognizes Students for Achieving 100 Per Cent Diploma Marks

- Twice a year, the Rocky View Schools (RVS) Board of Trustees recognizes students who obtain a perfect mark of 100 per cent on a provincial diploma exam. Due to impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, this is the first recognition of these student accomplishments since 2020. o Keisha Basi from Cochrane High School earned 100 per cent in Biology 30
- o Kai Suzuki from Airdrie's Bert Church High School earned 100 per cent in both Physics 30 and Biology 30

Board Requests 32 Urgently Needed Modulars from Alberta Education

- The need for more space for students in RVS is urgent as enrolment continues to climb adding 1,294 more students in RVS schools this year. The current overall utilization rate in RVS is 91 per cent up four per cent from last year and is expected to continue to rise to 101 per cent by 2026 if no new schools or modular units are approved by the provincial government.
- In addition to the new schools in Airdrie, Cochrane and Chestermere requested of the government, RVS is requesting 32 modular classrooms as part of Alberta Education's Annual Modular Classroom Program.

Renovation of the School on Powell Street in Cochrane to Proceed

- RVS re-acquired the school building and associated land located at 129 Powell Street in Cochrane at the end of September. Since 1993, the Calgary Catholic School Division had operated the Holy Spirit School at this location.
- The building has a current capacity for 332 students, with space for an additional 150 if six modular units were to be added to the facility. Utilizing this building for RVS students would help to alleviate pressure in some other schools, as utilization rates in Cochrane are very high at 97 per cent.
- Trustees approved spending capital reserve funds to make upgrades to the building to ensure it will meet the needs of the school community. The

estimated cost of these upgrades is \$2.8 million. If work begins immediately, the school will be open to receive students in September 2023.

• The Board also approved directing the superintendent to proceed with a student accommodation consultation and bring forward recommendations in the spring of 2023 for accommodating students in the facility
